(Forms submitted at final lecture,
April 16, 1974.)

There were 171 persons registered in the course; approximately 125 were in attendance on the final night. 86 persons returned the Evaluation forms.

1. RATINGS OF SPEAKERS (percentages adjusted for those who did not indicate ratings)

2. REQUESTS FOR FOLLOW-UP

Of the 86 respondents, 75 requested some follow-up programs, and 71 of those indicated their preference for a mixed (i.e. men and women) audience, rather than an audience restricted to one sex only. Of these, 16 males who came in as a couple wanted mixed follow-ups, and 9 males who came as singles wanted mixed follow-ups. Twenty-two females who came in a couple wanted mixed follow-ups, and 21 females who came as singles wanted a mixed follow-up. Of the rest, 4 indicated preference for segregated follow-ups, and three others wanted some format which would include mixed and segregated.

2 wanted consciousness-raising only.

That indicates the heaviest desire is for a workshop format, with either a lecture series, or lecturers involved.

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5. Among the most frequent of the favourable comments were expressions of appreciation for offering such a series. Also, a significant number of respondents felt that the discussion period and the types of questions the audience asked was unexpected and very valuable.

Among the critical comments, one of the most frequent was "not enough time for discussion", a feeling of superficiality, i.e. that the sessions had just scratched the surface; also that the group was too large, and the room was not conducive to discussion.
