Options for Women, late April, Burnaby. One day conference on employment, careers, education, stress, time management, mid-life options, and other topics of interest to women.

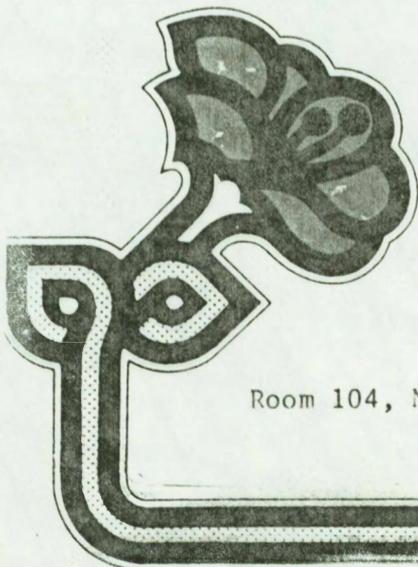
